



International Construction Adjudication Course Brochure

The **International Institute of Construction Arbitrators (“IICArb”)** – is an institution established to administer construction disputes – exclusive to the construction industry.

Adjudication as an alternative form of dispute resolution is the global preferred method for resolving construction disputes – most standard and ad hoc construction contracts contain dispute resolution procedures in terms of which adjudication is one and generally a precursor to arbitration.

The process of resolving disputes through adjudication is rapidly and continuously increasing. It is therefore imperative to have thorough understanding of what the adjudication process entails and more specifically the role, duties and jurisdiction of the adjudicator.

This course is best suitable to individuals who want to become a qualified and accredited adjudicator or individuals who are interested in gaining or expanding their knowledge of construction adjudication.

Admission requirements

- Delegates should ideally have the necessary work experience in the construction sector and basic understanding of adjudication.
- Delegates who want to become accredited adjudicators will still need to comply with IICarb's criteria – completion of this course does not automatically render a delegate an accredited adjudicator.

Course programme and assessment

- Delegates will receive access to a Practical Guide and the three (3) books above
- Delegates will also receive access to online workshops and videos
- Assignments (multiple choice questions) must be completed and submitted for marking
- A final assessment (examination based) will be completed and submitted for marking
- A pass rate of 70%

How the course is presented

- The training course is online through correspondence learning with online video content

Duration

- Delegates have up to 12 weeks in which to complete the course. The course can be completed in less than 12 weeks – depending on the delegates' progress. Extension of the course is allowed for three (3) additional months on application.

Accreditation and certification
